ABOUT EDWARD E. CARLSON

Edward E. Carlson was one of the most notable civic leaders in the Puget Sound region. During his lifetime, Mr. Carlson was President, Chairman and Director of Western International Hotels (now Westin), and President, CEO and Chairman of UAL, Inc. and United Airlines, Inc. His volunteerism locally and nationally earned many awards for his civic and professional achievements including: First Citizen of Seattle (1965), University of Washington Outstanding Alumnus (1970), Horatio Alger Award (1975), Legion of Honor Award (1983) and State of Washington Medal of Merit (1988). Mr. Carlson's active involvement in his community exemplifies the Leadership Tomorrow mission.

ABOUT THE EDWARD E. CARLSON OUTSTANDING ALUMNI AWARD

The Leadership Tomorrow Outstanding Alumni Award was established in 1988 to recognize an individual through his or her leadership that has significantly contributed to the well-being of the community. It was renamed in 1993 in honor of Edward E. Carlson, one of Puget Sound's most notable leaders.

Only one Leadership Tomorrow graduate is selected each year. Recipients of the award receive a grant of \$1,000 to be donated to the non-profit organization of their choice.
